Investigator

The Office of Police Complaints (OPC), a District of Columbia government agency that investigates citizen complaints of police misconduct, seeks to hire an investigator. OPC investigators, who report to the chief investigator and two other supervisors, are responsible for conducting administrative investigations of the use of unnecessary or excessive force, harassment, discrimination, and other types of misconduct allegations made against D.C. Metropolitan Police Department and Housing Authority officers.

DUTIES:

The major duties of an OPC investigator include, but are not limited to: planning and conducting investigations; interviewing and taking statements from complainants, witnesses, and police officers; gathering and analyzing evidence; making credibility determinations; and preparing well organized and thorough investigative reports.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must have: (1) a four-year degree from an accredited college or university; (2) relevant investigative experience; (3) excellent interpersonal skills; (4) strong writing skills; and (5) good judgment and high ethical standards. Candidates with Spanish-speaking ability are strongly encouraged to apply. Applicants must also be able to work with diverse populations and have excellent organizational and time-management skills. A demonstrable interest or background in civil rights, criminal justice, or law enforcement is preferred.
