



## GOVERNMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA OFFICE OF POLICE COMPLAINTS

### COMPLAINT EXAMINERS

The District of Columbia Office of Police Complaints (OPC) is seeking attorneys to adjudicate police misconduct complaints filed by the public against sworn officers of the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) and the District of Columbia Housing Authority Police Department (DCHAPD). This **is not** a full-time position, but rather a civic opportunity to help improve police accountability in the District of Columbia. Complaint examiners are compensated on a per-case basis. Further, complaint examiners must adjudicate at least one case assignment per fiscal year, and attend one training per fiscal year.

#### Required Qualifications

In order to qualify for the position, candidates must:

1. Have a general reputation for competence, impartiality, and integrity;
2. Reside in the District;
3. Be a member in good standing of the District of Columbia Bar;
4. Have been a licensed attorney (of any U.S. jurisdiction) for at least 5 years; and
5. Have litigation or arbitration experience.

A demonstrated commitment to public service is also preferred. Candidates may not be current or former employees of MPD or DCHAPD. Selected candidates will receive training from OPC staff.
